This strategic plan for BLCDF (2025-2027) results from collaboration among the Strategic Planning Committee, CEO Steven Wamala (Uganda), and the BLCDF board (which includes members from Australia and New Zealand)

Overview & History

Barnabas Legacy Children's Dream Foundation (BLCDF) is a Christian Child Care Ministry that cares for vulnerable, orphaned and needy children living in Katunda Village and the surrounding rural villages in Buikwe District, Jinja, Uganda.

Founded in 2013 by Pastor Steven Wamala, BLCDF began as a mission to support vulnerable children in Katunda, Uganda. Pastor Steven, who serves as a teacher and pastor, established God's Vine International, which evolved into BLCDF in February 2020 as a registered not-for-profit organisation.

The Foundation has grown with support from Maree Cutler-Naroba (Mama Queen) and Tevita Naroba (Papa Chief) of Australia and friends (from New Zealand, Australia and Fiji), helping BLCDF to expand its community support initiatives and the establishment of the Agape Star Christian School which opened in January 2023.

Christian Education: At the core of BLCDF's educational approach is a curriculum designed to strengthen critical thinking, ethical decision-making and personal leadership skills. A Christian-based education lays a foundation for students to become responsible and empowered members of their community who contribute positively to society.

Community impact: BLCDF goes beyond traditional education by actively engaging with families and community members. Through vocational training, outreach and support initiatives, BLCDF aims to lift entire communities and promote lasting change by equipping individuals and families with skills for economic independence and resilience.

Skill development: To empower families and foster self-sufficiency, BLCDF delivers training in practical skills such as farming, cooking, craft-making and micro-gardening. These skills support income generation and strengthen the community's economic resilience.

Community advocacy: Through child protection initiatives, BLCDF actively promotes children's rights, safety, and well-being. Women's empowerment programs also form a critical part of its advocacy, enhancing community support for family stability and individual growth.

Successes to date (in the last 5 years): 2020 to 2024

- Partnership with international donors and restructuring into BLCDF (2020 and 2021)
- Fundraising achievements and facility improvements (2020 to 2024)
- Establishment of a permanent BLCDF office and headquarters for the women's business projects (2021)
- Building of Kindergarten and Primary campuses Agape Star Christian School (2021 and 2022)
- Running of the school for 2 years, growing from 150 students in Year 1 (2023) to 202 students in Year 2 (2024)
- Conducting children's Bible programs, women's forums and seasonal community events (2021 to 2024)
- Building of a Dining Shade and Kitchen Area for the children (2024)
- Acquiring of the School's official land title (2024)

Challenges ahead:

- Sustainable resourcing for school operational costs and expansion of facilities.
- Growing community demand to take on more students at the school, but with parents/guardians who cannot support the cost of doing so.
- Maintaining quality teaching and non-teaching staff year to year.
- Balancing the growth of the school alongside the management of the the sustainability projects

Strengths

Strong Christian mission: BLCDF is grounded in a faith-based mission that guides its work, instilling purpose and shared values among staff, students and community members. This Foundation builds trust and aligns the organisation with supportive partners and donors who share its vision.

Dedicated leadership: Led by Pastor Steven Wamala, the leadership team demonstrates a deep commitment to service. They foster a culture of integrity and resilience that drives effective program delivery and sustains morale through challenges.

Effective partnerships: Collaboration with local and international supporters enhances BLCDF's reach and resources, contributing to successful initiatives in education, community engagement, and spiritual growth.

Weaknesses

Resource constraints: BLCDF faces financial limitations that affect its ability to maintain operational expenses and expand programs. Dependence on donations and limited grant opportunities create challenges in meeting growing needs.

Limited facilities for educational expansion: While demand for BLCDF's educational programs increases, current facilities limit enrolment and restrict the potential for adding higher-grade levels or specialised training programs, which impedes growth.

Opportunities

Growing partnerships: BLCDF has opportunities to cultivate additional partnerships with churches, NGOs and other organisations that are aligned with its mission, potentially attracting more funding, resources and expertise.

Community needs for vocational training and education programs: With high demand for vocational training, BLCDF can further develop skill-building programs that empower youth and families. Programs in agriculture, crafts and small-business skills can foster economic independence for graduates.

Threats

Economic instability affecting fundraising: Economic downturns, inflation or currency fluctuations can reduce donor contributions and increase operating costs, creating uncertainties for BLCDF's budget and potentially limiting program capacity.

Rising operational costs: Increases in costs for essentials such as utilities, food, and transportation impact BLCDF's financial stability. Rising expenses for educational supplies, staffing, and facility maintenance further strain resources, posing a risk to service continuity.



6. FUTURE OUTLOOK AND GOALS

Goals for 2025 to 2027:

- 1. Expand Agape Star Christian School to support up to 350 children.
- 2. Strengthen partnerships and funding to ensure long-term sustainability.
- 3. Expand the campus facilities to Secondary classes.
- 4. Build a Dorm Facility (Dream Star Children's Centre) to provide boarding facilities for up to 50 students.
- 5. Purchase an additional van for transporting learners
- 6. Expand the number of paid teaching and non-teaching staff in line with increased student numbers and boarding facilities.

1. Expand Agape Star Christian School to support up to 350 Children:

By 2027, BLCDF aims to have 350 children attend its school, increasing access to quality Christian education in Uganda. This growth will require additional classrooms, teachers, and resources to maintain high standards and personalised attention. The focus will also be on providing a holistic curriculum that includes academics, moral guidance and spiritual growth.

3. Expand Campus facilities to include Secondary classes:

By 2026, BLCDF will expand the school to include secondary education, which will help children transition smoothly from primary to higher education within the same supportive environment. This addition requires new classrooms, specialised subject teachers and curriculum development to prepare students for higher education or vocational paths.

5. Purchase an additional van for transporting students:

By 2026, BLCDF will expand its vision of acquiring a second minibus to help transport students to and from school. Some students have to travel a distance to attend the school, and it would be good to facilitate their transport so they can quickly and comfortably be at school on time during school days.

2. Strengthen partnerships and funding to ensure long-term sustainability:

BLCDF will actively pursue diverse funding sources to ensure financial stability and growth, including partnerships with like-minded organisations, churches and NGOs. Fundraising initiatives will aim to create a balanced support portfolio, reducing reliance on any single funding source. Strengthened partnerships will enhance BLCDF's resource base, enabling future growth and resilience.

4. Build a Dorm Facility (Dream Star Children's Centre) to provide boarding for up to 50 students:

In 2025 and 2026, BLCDF will complete dormitory facilities to provide safe, stable boarding accommodation for up to 50 students each school term. The Dream Star Children's Centre will include dorm rooms, study areas and supervision to support students' academic, personal and spiritual growth. This facility will foster a nurturing environment that aligns with BLCDF's commitment to holistic Christian education and student well-being.

6. Expand the number of paid teaching and non-teaching staff in line with increased student numbers and boarding facilities.

By 2027, BLCDF will increase the number of paid teaching and support staff to meet the growing needs of the school, including the new boarding facilities and rising student enrolment. This expansion will ensure a high standard of education, care and operational efficiency, supporting all students' academic and personal development. Employing additional staff will strengthen the school's capacity to provide a holistic, nurturing environment in alignment with BLCDF's values and commitment to


Child welfare and education: Ensuring each child has access to education, nutritious meals and spiritual growth opportunities.

The school aims to support 350 children by 2027, offering not only primary but secondary education as campus facilities expand.
