COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

Agape Star Christian School (ASCS) Academic Performance Overview

During **Term 1** (January - March 2025), the school recorded strong student engagement and staffing outcomes. Peak enrolment reached 204 students in February 2025, with average daily attendance consistently between 190 and 200 students, and the highest single-day attendance of 201 students recorded on 1 April 2025. Academic outcomes were positive, with a 100% completion rate achieved, alongside the successful integration of five newly recruited, committed Christian teachers into the school community.

During **Term 2** (April - August 2025), the school strengthened its global and community focus through the successful hosting of a New Zealand mission visit, fostering international cultural integration and enhanced global awareness among students. Academic continuity was maintained throughout special programs, ensuring curriculum standards remained strong. The term also marked a significant milestone with the ribbon cutting and official opening of the BEADLE Block, celebrating important infrastructure developments that support learning and community life.

During **Term 3** (September - October 2025), the school demonstrated strong operational excellence during a key promotional period. A strategic planning meeting held on 13 September 2025 supported effective pre-term preparation, contributing to an average daily attendance of 198 students. Staff performance was exemplary, with a 100% teacher return rate enabling immediate class resumption, while the boarding program achieved a 100% return rate, with all 15 boarders resuming as scheduled.

Dream Star Care Boarding Facility - Historic Completion

MAMA AIDA HOUSE (GIRLS' DORMITORY)

Mama Aida House, the girls' dormitory, provides accommodation for more than 10 female students and is named in honour of the late Mama Aida, CEO Steven Wamala's mother. The facility is currently operating at 100% occupancy with a full return rate and offers dedicated study areas alongside comfortable sleeping quarters to support both academic focus and student wellbeing.







DRUA HOUSE (BOY'S DORMITORY)

DRUA House, the boys' dormitory, is named in appreciation of the support provided by Fijian families within the community and accommodates more than 10 male students. Upon further funding being received in 2026, this facility will have new bunk beds and allow us to take our Dormitory development program to the next level.

BEADLE BLOCK

The BEADLE Block was dedicated in memory of Brian and Jill Mellar, New Zealand pioneers whose mission work dates back to the 1990s. Officially opened in May 2025, during the visit of Sue & Mike with a ribbon-cutting ceremony, the facility carries strong historical significance, symbolically connecting early mission efforts with the school's ongoing impact and growth today.

KITCHEN CONSTRUCTION PROJECT - MAJOR DEVELOPMENT PHASE 1 COMPLETION (SEPTEMBER 2025)

Foundation preparation was successfully completed in the final week of September, with construction commencing as planned. The project acknowledges the generous contribution of Papa Mike and Mama Sue from New Zealand, whose support is enabling this development. Once completed, the works are expected to significantly enhance meal preparation capacity and improve food safety standards.







BOARDING FACILITY ENHANCEMENTS

Ongoing boarding facility enhancements include progressed procurement of 15 complete bed and mattress sets, reflecting continued investment in student wellbeing. These improvements are designed to significantly lift living standards by increasing comfort and dignity for boarders, while supporting continuous optimisation of boarding infrastructure.

PLANNED INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

Fundraising efforts across Adelaide, New Zealand, and Fijian communities have been instrumental in supporting key infrastructure and resourcing initiatives, including the completion of dormitory finishing works to meet boarding capacity and the installation of toilet facilities beneath the lower dormitory. Progress was also made on administrative office spaces, with completion and painting supported primarily by Rosa and Fijian families, while the resource centre remains pending. Additional investments included the purchase of 10 extra desks from non-BLCDF funds, full uniform procurement for all students, and continued facility maintenance through ongoing improvements and repairs.



ARISE WOMEN IN BUSINESS PROJECTS

Skills Development and Empowerment

Skills Development and Empowerment programs continued to deliver strong social and economic outcomes. In May 2025, the baking initiative reached a key milestone, producing 324 cakes for school children to support student nutrition. The program also transferred marketable skills to women, strengthening economic empowerment, local enterprise, and community integration through local sourcing and distribution.

Sewing and Tailoring

Sewing and tailoring workshops progressed with sewing machines successfully transferred to the field office, directly benefiting participants including Olivia, Teddy, and Susan. Feedback was highly positive, with a strong sustainability focus on self-employment and income-generating skills.

Energy and Livelihood Initiatives

Alternative energy and livelihood initiatives expanded with the transfer of a charcoal oven to the field office, improving access to low-cost, environmentally conscious fuel and small-scale income opportunities. Business stall operations also continued into 2025, supporting operational sustainability and local entrepreneurship.

Sustainability and Agriculture

Agricultural initiatives progressed steadily. The banana plantation was well maintained, supporting food security and income potential. Planning for the goat project advanced, with funding secured by March 2025 and implementation scheduled for Term 1 holidays, providing a long-term protein source and future income through sustainable operations.



INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS AND CULTURAL EXCHANGE

The **New Zealand Mission Visit in May 2025** delivered meaningful leadership, education, and infrastructure outcomes. The mission was led by Papa Mike, who supported sports coordination and infrastructure initiatives, and Mama Sue, who contributed to cultural education and provided funding for kitchen construction. Educational and cultural activities enriched student learning through lessons on New Zealand geography, history, and traditions, alongside the teaching of two traditional NZ songs. Sports development was strengthened through football, netball, and rugby training, while shared meals and cultural exchange deepened community fellowship. The visit also coincided with the official ribbon cutting of the Beadle Block, honouring the legacy of 1990s mission work in Arua and celebrating the strength of international partnerships and community pride.

The **Australia/Fiji Mission Visit in August 2025** further reinforced global collaboration through a diverse and skilled team, including Mama Nic in community engagement, Mama Maree as cofounder and strategic planning lead, and Papa Te in musical instruction and cultural exchange. A highlight of the visit was a vibrant mini-concert featuring guitar sessions, cultural songs, traditional Ugandan and contemporary dance performances, and student-led group and individual showcases, creating an uplifting celebration involving families and the wider community. The mission concluded with the official opening of the Dream Star Care boarding facility, marking a historic milestone for the school. This achievement was witnessed by international partners, reaffirming global support, with permanent commemorative plaques installed in October to honour the occasion and the shared journey.



FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP AND SUSTAINABILITY

In 2025, the organisation demonstrated strong financial performance through disciplined operations and targeted investment. All staff were paid on time, superannuation and annual subscriptions were fully met, tax obligations were completed, and major infrastructure upgrades to boarding facilities and kitchens were delivered. Revenue was diversified through international partnerships, local support, and business stall operations. Despite unsuccessful grant funding, investment priorities remained focused on education quality, essential infrastructure, community empowerment, and sustainability initiatives.
